

# From the Pastor

For what are you thankful? I am thankful for the opportunity our young people had to attend a youth gathering in New Orleans this past summer. I'm thankful for the couples who have been married this year. I'm thankful for the peace we know in the promises of God's grace, confident that our loved ones who have died are now experiencing this resurrection promise. I'm thankful for our Sunday School teachers and Bible study leaders and all the students who are learning more about God. I thank God for the 8 students who were confirmed on October 27, affirming their baptismal promises. I am thankful for all of you!

Reformation Day is a time in the church year when we commemorate the day Martin Luther nailed a document of 95 theses to a church door in Wittenberg Germany, and we recognize the importance of ongoing reforms in the Church. Reformation continues daily as life happens to us and we learn new ways of being Church together.

In affirming their baptismal promises, these students begin to articulate their faith as children of God at this time in their lives. (see their faith statements in this newsletter!) We pray together with all the baptized that God will continue to grow and strengthen us in our faith, and encourage us to share our faith with those around us. Confirmation is not the end of learning about who God is and who we are as God's children, but rather a time we are reminded of God's ongoing work to reform and transform us to be church together for the sake of the world.

All Saints Sunday is a day in the church year that we remember all the saints of God who have gone before us. We are reminded that we are ALL sinners and also saints, by the grace of God. When claimed by God in our baptisms, we hear God's promises of forgiveness, life, and salvation. When we confirm these promises for ourselves in an affirmation of baptism (also known as confirmation), we can be confident that our loved ones are in the arms of God, and so are we.

I encourage you this month to think of one different thing you are thankful for each day. Write it down, say a prayer, let others know, and in doing so our faith is strengthened and our faith is shared. Thanks be to God!

# BDM VITALITY SURVEY



# Congratulations to Mason Michael Schmidt


