#### Setting Expectations

Throughout this Epiphany season, we have been focusing on Paul's letters to the Corinthians. In these letters, Paul highlights the gifts that have been given to the people of Corinth and reminds them that not one gift is greater than another. We all have the gift of the Spirit, and without it we cannot proclaim Jesus is our Lord. We all have unique gifts that contribute to the function and mission of our communities. We all have the gift of God's love, and we are called as disciples of Jesus to share these gifts with all people and all creation. (1 Corinthians 12-13) As we work together to build relationships - both with God and with one another - it's important to communicate.

It's always a good idea to begin with a set of goals and communicate those goals in a way that effectively sets expectations for all participants in any new relationship. When I was extended the call to serve this parish, there were several things you outlined as expectations for me. Some of you have asked for things to change, and others of you miss 'the way things used to be'. Without change, we cannot grow, individually or as a community of faith.

When called to serve this parish, I was asked to do the following:

- 1. Become acquainted with the members of Belfield, Daglum & Medora, encouraging them to become active participants in our Christian journey together.
- 2. Acknowledge, raise up, and utilize members' talents and abilities. Be a visible pastoral presence in the Belfield, Daglum & Medora communities.
- 3. Welcome members of all ages, meet with them where they are in their faith journey and guide them in their personal relationship with God, especially the youth!
- 4. Coordinate and lead the pastoral care ministries of the three congregations.
- 5. Work with members and the councils to build up attendance and to restore relationships with members.

I have also been encouraged to participate in Synod activities and Badlands Ministries Bible Camp.

Here are some of the ways I have worked toward these goals:

- Weekly phone calls, visits, and written notes, connecting with members and visitors and those who are unable to attend in person. This has been difficult without a directory for me to know how to reach some of you. I continue to encourage you to reach out anytime you'd like to visit!
- I have tried to encourage each of you with the gifts I have observed and I know that we have had more of you volunteer to read Scriptures during worship, and I'm looking forward to some of you sharing musical instruments with us for Easter.

- 3. I am excited to connect with our youngest members and I have enjoyed leading confirmation and youth gatherings. I have worked to put together a new study for several of our young adults (and others!) who have expressed interest in how to read the Bible.
- 4. I have actively called and visited any of our members in nursing home facilities, as well as others who have been ill or unable to worship with us in person. I have also been involved in visiting those who request a Lutheran pastor from the hospital or other assisted living situations. I would welcome others to make these calls and visits as well!
- 5. Without a directory, it has been difficult to know who we are missing. As we begin to build our next parish directory, I will continue to work through older ones, along with our existing records, to update records and continue building relationships. It is my understanding that some who had not worshiped with this parish for many years have begun to reconnect. All of our councils are reading through "The Invitational Christian," a book by Dave Daubert, in an effort to imagine what it looks like to be welcoming.

As a Pastor in the Badlands Conference of the Western North Dakota Synod, I have connected with other leaders in our conference by way of joint worship services, Devotions from the Badlands, and LYO advisor for our conference. I have recently been elected Dean of our confer-





#### A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

This Month's Writer: Murray Sagsveen, Synod Attorney

We are entering a new year, and many of us have adopted resolutions or goals for the following twelve months. Let me suggest a few governancerelated resolutions/goals for the congregation councils of all synod congregations during 2022:

- Is the congregation's membership list current? The <u>Model Constitution for Congregations</u>states that the "Congregation Council shall provide for an annual review of the membership roster" (C12.07.) and that only voting members may vote at congregation meetings (\*C8.02.c. and C10.06).
- Has the congregation recently updated its constitution to conform with the Model Constitution for Congregations. If not, the congregation council or a council-appointed committee should plan to review the existing document, review likely amendments to the Model Constitute tion for Congregations by the Churchwide Assembly this August, and draft amendments for submission to the congregation's annual meeting in late 2022 or early 2023.
- 3. Has the congregation recently reviewed its bylaws (if any) to ensure they do not conflict with the congregation's constitution or the <u>ELCA's social statements</u>?
- 4. Has the congregation incorporated its bylaws (if any) into the constitution document as urged by the ELCA in the introduction to the Model Constitution for Congregations?
- 5. Does the congregation have an endowment fund and, if so, was it established prior to 2011? The resolution or bylaw establishing the endowment fund should be reviewed to determine if it has been updated to address state laws passed in 2011 related to qualified endow ments (N.D.C.C. § 57-38-01.21) and to restricted accounts (N.D.C.C. § 10-33-21(7)).
- 6. When the congregation was incorporated, it filed articles of incorporation with the North Dakota Secretary of State. Many congregations were established more than a century ago, so the articles of incorporation may contain articles that conflict with state law or the conger gation's constitution. The articles of incorporation should be located, reviewed, and (if necessary) updated.
- 7. Has the congregation council adopted key policies such as related to personnel, ethics, conflicts of interest, volunteer management, ap propriate workplace environment, reporting inappropriate behavior, and supervision of minors?
