#### From the Pastor

#### Resurrection Life

Some of my favorite things about spring are the signs of new life around us! This year we might be wondering, "When!?!" When will we finally see the ground underneath the snow?

In our Lenten season this year, these 40 days before Easter, we have spent time in midweek worship following the teaching of Martin Luther's Small Catechism. We started with the Ten Commandments and moved through Holy Communion, the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles' Creed, finishing with Holy Baptism. What fun to have different leaders from our area share in this teaching! I am thankful for the opportunity you had to hear from other leaders, and the gift it was to be reminded of all the ways God uses to teach us and help us grow in our faith.

The Ten Commandments give us a guideline to live in love for God and love for our neighbors. The sacrament of Holy Communion is a gift of nourishment to share in community, reminding us that we are forgiven alongside our neighbor at this table. The Lord's Prayer is one example of how to have a conversation with God, specifically shared by Jesus. The Apostles' Creed is one example of a faith statement that we all share in common. Finally, Holy Baptism is a sacrament that God does to us once and we are encouraged to remember daily. In our daily encounters with water, we are constantly reminded of God's forgiveness, redemption, and eternal salvation promised to us.

Martin Luther writes in the Small Catechism, in response to the significance of baptism, "It (baptism) signifies that the old person in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned and die through daily sorrow for sin and through repentance, and on the other hand that daily a new person is to

come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever." When we come out of the waters of baptism we are wet! How do we continue to walk "wet" through our lives? Can we leave a trail of wet footprints or water droplets like breadcrumbs for others to follow? Maybe that looks like sharing a smile, a hug, or a meal. Maybe that looks like serving in the community or praying for those in need.

As we move from the season of Lent into the season of Easter, let us identify the places where we need to change both individually and as a community of faith. When we live "wet" others see Jesus. Together we can expect to see new life, however deep it is under the snow, because God promises resurrection!

The parsonage is in need of new windows on the main floor. The current windows are original to the house and frost up in the winter.


10 windows are needed at an average cost of \$2000 per window for a total of \$20,000 for all of them.
